Trap Neuter Return benefits the cats and the neighbourhood.

All of the feral – unowned – cats are going to be spayed or neutered and eartipped (the universal symbol of a neutered cat). Back in their outdoor home, they will not reproduce – no more kittens!

Trap Neuter Return improves their lives and yours. It is effective and humane. Other approaches for feral cats just don't work.

You Can Help!

- Keep your pet cats inside on the above date (so they won't accidentally be trapped.)
- Contact us if you are feeding any cats in the neighbourhood or surrounding area. The more we know about where the cats eat and spend their time, the more successful we'll be.
- Don't feed the outdoor cats on the day before trapping. (Always continue to provide water). Feral cats will enter traps only when they are hungry. Move your pet cat's feeding inside on the above date if you normally feed outside. Once our trapping day is over, you can go back to feeding the cats.
